When Did First Baptist Hamilton Start?

Last month, we were considering the question, "When did First Baptist get started?" The question was provoked when Rev. Timothy Mohon was with us at First Baptist Church of Hamilton for the American Baptist History & Polity Workshop, Saturday, February 10, 2024. We are looking at A GENERAL HISTORY of THE FIRST BAPTIST CHURCH of Hamilton, Ohio 1946.

A mission-minded remnant from the division of the Hamilton-Rossville Baptist Church were together for a prayer meeting December 31, 1841 at the home of Dr. Loami Rigdon, when they felt the call to begin anew a missionary Baptist Church in Hamilton. As they slowly organized, the were received under the watchcare of the Muddy Creek Church, and later became a branch of the Lockland church, being the nearest Baptist church.

"After April 15, 1844, preaching was supplied every other Sunday by visiting pastors. Meetings were held in either the Court House or Female Academy at the corner of Market Street and Monument Avenue. Finally, the members felt their need for a regular pastor and called Elder Bryant at a salary of two-hundred dollars a year, to preach every other Sunday. He arrived to preach his first sermon October 20. 1844.



"Two months after the arrival of Elder Bryant, a meeting was called at the home of Bro. Rigdon, the result of which was the adoption of a resolution to circulate a paper, soliciting aid for erection of a meeting house on Third Street. This house was in due time erected on the west side of Third Street between Market and Dayton Streets. With an addition, a few years later, it was occupied until 1858.

"Elder Bryant continued pastor until November 1845, just a few months previous to the dedication ceremonies, when he accepted a call to the Fifth Street Church in Cincinnati. The church parted with this brother with great reluctance, for he was a good man, and had done much to advance the cause of religion in Hamilton.

RECOGNITION IN THE MIAMI BAPTIST ASSOCIATION

It was a great week in the history of The First Baptist Church of Hamilton, when ceremonies were conducted, to make it an independent organization. On April 14, 1846, the new church building was dedicated and on the following day, a council convened and after due examination of the Articles of Faith, Church Covenant, and evidences of organization, they proceeded with ceremonies of recognition. Rev. John L. Moore preached the sermon, Elder L. Osborn offered prayer, Bro. Bryant gave the hand of Fellowship, and the First Baptist Church of Hamilton was received into the fellowship of churches and united with the Miami Baptist Association.

"On the third day of the ceremonies, April 16th, William Rooney was ordained and set apart for the work of the ministry. Bro. Finley preached the sermon, Rev. John L. Moore offered prayer, Bro. Osborn gave the hand of fellowship to the pastor, and in turn to the people. Officers of the church were elected, five trustees being Dr. L. Rigdon, Aaron Potter, J. L. Batcheldor, Joseph Shotwell and J. S. Beatty. The treasurer became Dr. L. Rigdon; the clerk, W. S. Going; and the deacons, Dr. L. Rigdon and Joseph Shotwell.

"During the ministry of Pastor Rooney, many united with the church and much progress was in evidence. When this good pastor left on June 4, 1848, a resolution expressive of the appreciation of the church was passed by a unanimous vote of the congregation.



"William Ashmore was called to the pastorate on September 22, 1848. He, too, was a young man and ordained in Hamilton soon after he had assumed his duties as pastor. His ministry was one of exception and his was truly of God. Believing his duties were more than to the congregation of his church, he labored from house to house fervently until June 1850, when he resigned to become a missionary. Although but a youth, his work was long remembered by the church and community. tendered care and comfort at the bed of sick, visited and assisted who were destitute, rendering always such aid and comfort as was needed. During the cholera epidemic in 1849, his labors were constantly among the poor and needy. Rev. Ashmore, as a missionary in China.

"When Rev. Ashmore left Hamilton, the church was passing through some trying times. For the next fifteen months, the church was without a pastor, the feeling being that it was impossible to maintain the salary of a pastor and pay off a church debt, which had accumulated during the period of depression. Meetings, however, were regularly held."

So, there we have the story of the start of First Baptist Church of Hamilton, Ohio. From our official charter, "when ceremonies were conducted, to make it an independent organization. On April 14, 1846...", our forefathers and mothers in the faith committed themselves to live and share the Gospel of Christ in the community. It was not always easy. Pastors came and were called away. But they remained true to the mission of sharing Christ.

So, First Baptist, your official birthday is April 14, 1846! HAPPY BIRTHDAY! And MANY more!


